

Bank of Scotland Path Questionnaire | 2017

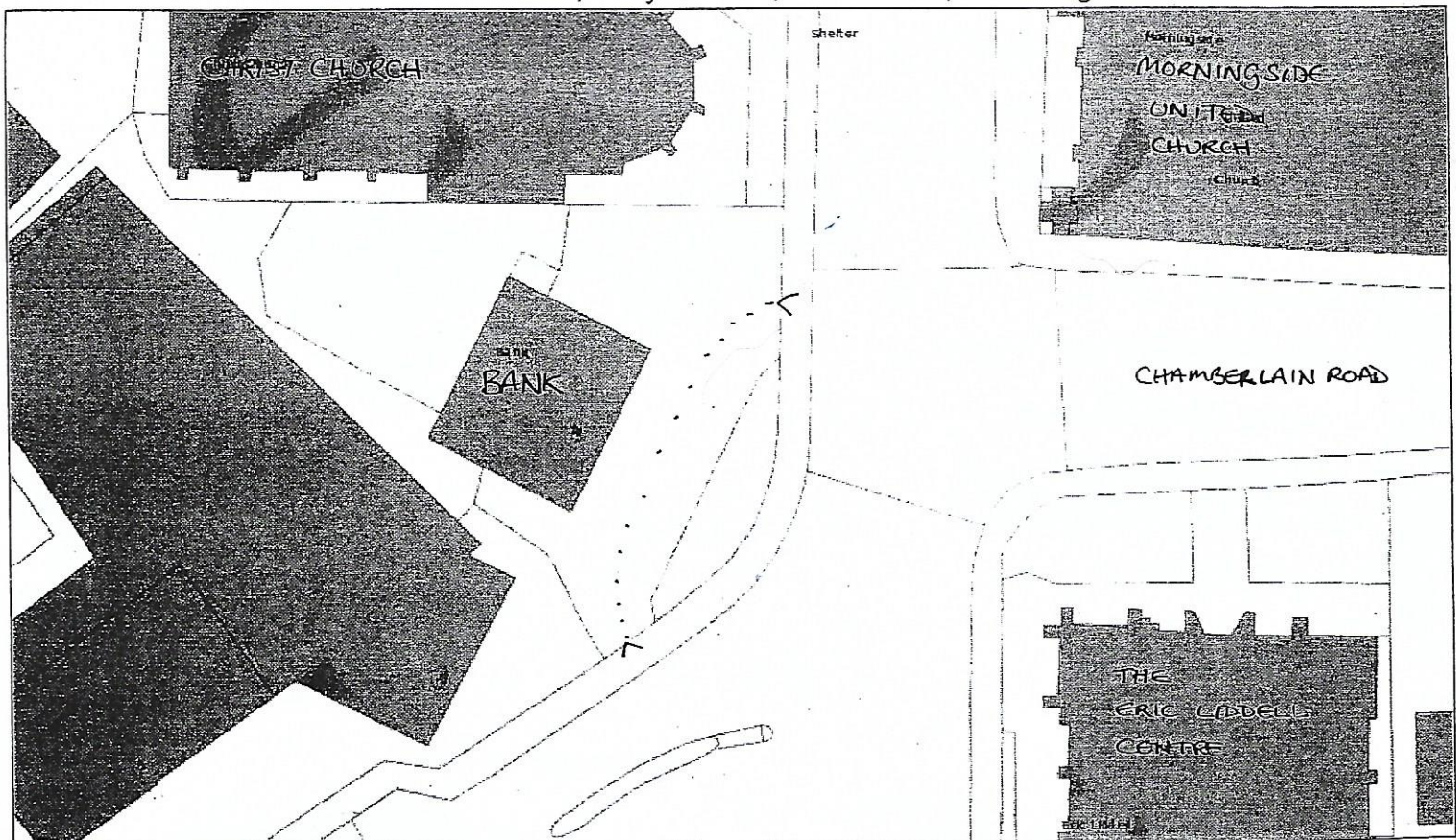
The Bank of Scotland grounds at Holy Corner have been used as path off the main road to Bruntsfield on a daily basis for many years by cyclists and pedestrians. The narrow pavements in the area have meant that the preferred safe route for local people has been through the bank grounds.

Residents have raised concerns that the public access across the Bank of Scotland site may be lost when the land is sold. Local Councillor Melanie Main is working with residents to safeguard public access: the public have been using this as a route for very many years, and it may well therefore be a Right of Way. A recorded Right of Way would safeguard continued access across the site, which may be important if there were proposals for changes, e.g: a building development in the grounds in the future. To establish the right and have it registered it is necessary to provide evidence from those who have used the route. This form includes all the information needed to give evidence.

A map attached below shows the likely route and entrances. Please mark the route you use most often on the map provided. If there are any routes or entrances you use that are not marked on the map, please add them on to the map. If you wish to include any other comments or information please do so below or attach a separate piece of paper.
